Ms. CLAUDIA BOKEL



Former Chair of the IOC Athletes' Commission and member of the IOC Executive Board until 2016, and IOC Member since 2008. She holds a Master in Chemistry and has worked as management consultant. As an Olympic athlete, she won a silver medal (fencing- épée, team) at the Athens 2004 Olympic Games and competed in Atlanta 1996 and Sydney 2000 Olympic Games. She is a senior facilitator of the IOC ACP Outreach Programme leading workshops in different countries to create awareness and help prepare athletes for their career transition. After the 2016 Rio Olympic games, when she finished her term as Chair of the Athletes' Commission, she joined The Adecco Group, a Human resources company partner of the IOC, to lead the IOC and IPC Athlete Career Programme.

ZORAN PRIMORAC – ITTF ACP OUTREACH TRAINER



Zoran Primorac (born 10 May 1969) is a retired table tennis player from Croatia. Along his extensive sports career, Zoran has been Two times European Champion, 2 times World Cup Winner and has competed at seven Olympic Games. Zoran is considered one of the best European players in the last 25 years. In 2016 Zoran represented the ITTF at the pilot programme of the IOC ACP with International Federations and he is an instructor of the Outreach workshops for ITTF.

NICCOLO CAMPRIANI – IOC



Niccolò Campriani (born November 6, 1987) is an Italian sport shooter who competed at three Olympic Games. At the same time, he managed to pursue his education on the USA and completed a Master in Sports Technology in the UK. Niccolò retired after achieving a very successful result at the 2016 Rio Olympic Games, having won an overall of 3 Gold medals and 1 silver medal during his Olympic career. Niccolò is currently working at the IOC for the Athlete Career Programme to help prepare athletes for their Career transition.

Ms Jovina Choo is a sailor from Singapore who participated in Rio 2016 Olympic Games and currently works for the IOC as the Olympian Intern. Jovina is involved in various projects including the Athlete Career Programme.
